## Zoning Fact Sheet

When applying for a zoning permit, you must draw a site plan. For residential structures, the setbacks are as follows:

Front Yard (from road right-of-way to structure) 40 feet

Rear Yard (from structure to property line) 25 feet

Side Yard (from structure to property line) 15 feet

Other structures, bed/mound, sewage tanks 10 feet

To bodies of water from structure to top of bank 50 feet

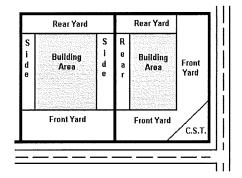
If the property is 1/2 acre, or less, in size residential <u>DETACHED ACCESSORY STRUCTURE</u> may use the following setbacks: (All other setbacks remain the same.)

Rear Yard 12.5 feet

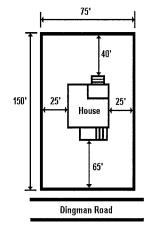
Side Yard

7.5 feet

The following sketch shows how the various yards are designated. Note the difference between regular lots and corner lots.



On corner lots a 75 foot Clear Site Triangle (C.S.T. on the above sketch) must be maintained. On properties less than 1 acre in size, the site plan <u>MUST</u> be prepared and sealed by a Pennsylvania Registered Surveyor.

# Effective Immediately

The following information will be required when applying for a zoning permit.

### Properties Less than One Acre in Size:

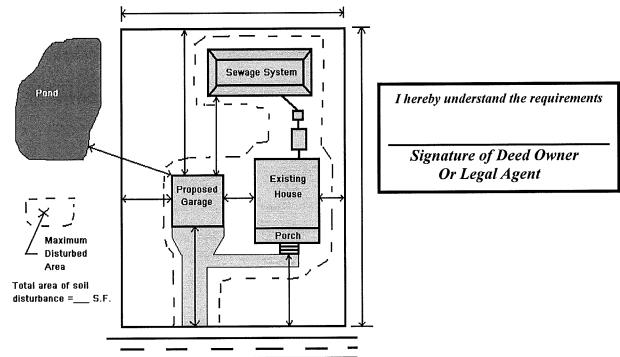
The site plan must be in the form of a surveyed site plan sealed by a Pennsylvania Registered Surveyor. The site plan must show all existing structures and amenities, all proposed structures and amenities and the distance between them.

#### **Properties One Acre or Larger:**

A surveyed site plan is preferred, however, the site plan <u>may</u> be prepared by the applicant <u>provided</u> that the applicant:

- 1. Accurately locates and flags the property corners (pins must be exposed).
- 2. Accurately flags the property lines (all sides).
- 3. Accurately site all existing structures and amenities and proposed structures and amenities on the site map.
- 4. Accurately stake/flag corners of proposed structure.
- Accurately measure and represent on the site plan the distance between existing and proposed structures and amenities and:
  - All other structures and amenities including sewage system.
  - The property lines
  - · The road right-of-way
  - Any stream, pond or other body of water on the property or within 50 feet of the property line

If the property pins and property lines are not properly located and accurately flagged and/or the site plan does not meet the above listed requirements, the application will be returned and a surveyed site plan will be required in order to resubmit.

Plan must show (at minimum): a) the dimensions of the property, b) the setback distances to the property lines, all other structures, the sewage system, all streams and bodies of water, c) the maximum area of soil disturbance, and, d) the total area in square feet of soil disturbance.
